

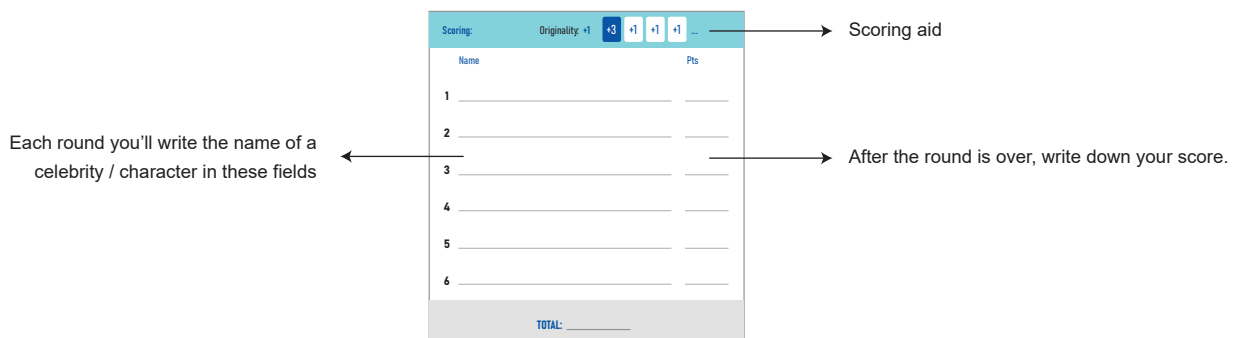
*A musician with 40 years or more with blue eyes named Michael. Go!*

In Name Drop, each round there will be a different name and an increasing set of characteristics. To score points, do your best to write down a celebrity / fictional character with that name that fits as many of those characteristics as you can. After 6 rounds, the player with most points is the winner

### Components and setup:

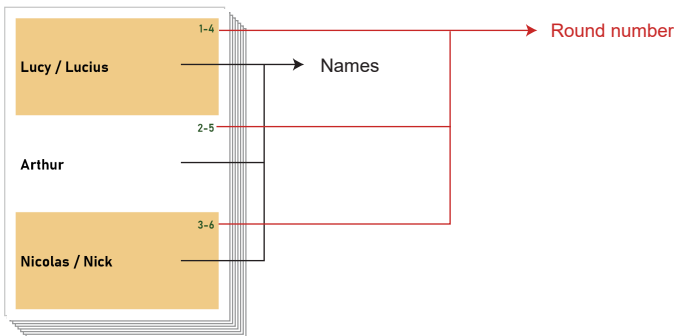
#### 1. 100 double-sided scoring sheets

Give 1 to each player.



#### 2. 55 cards with names and characteristics

Shuffle them and place the deck in the center of the table with the name side up.



**Playing a round:**

1. Set a 90-second timer in your cell phone.
2. Flip the top card from the deck, revealing a characteristic. If this is not the 1st round, push the other characteristics to the right, and place the new one beneath the deck.
3. Use one of the 3 names shown in the name card, according to the current round:
  - first name for 1st and 4th round
  - second name for 2nd and 5th round
  - third name for the 3rd and 6th round
4. Each player has until the timer goes off to write down a celebrity or fictional character with that name. If the person you thought of also fits the characteristics below, you'll score extra points.
5. When the time is over, everyone scores

**Scoring:**

1. Score 1 point if you were the only one who thought of that celebrity or fictional character
2. Score 3 points if they fit into the newest revealed characteristic
3. Score 1 point for each other characteristic they fit into.

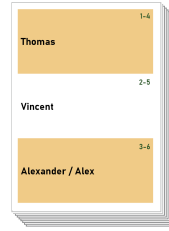
If you got confused and the person you thought of doesn't have the name shown on the name card, you score zero in this round.

If you were not the only one to think of a person and they don't fit into any of the characteristics, you also score zero.

**Game end:**

The game ends after the 6th round. Whoever has more points is the winner.

In case of a tie, the player who scored higher in the last round wins. If the tie remains, compare scores in the 5th round and so on, until a winner is determined.



**1st round:**

You opened the first card, revealing the first characteristic (**Musician**) and name (**Thomas**, because we are in the 1st round).

You all have 90 seconds to think of a celebrity called Thomas.

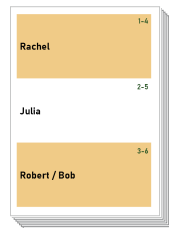
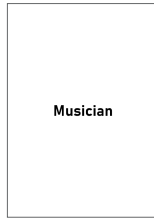
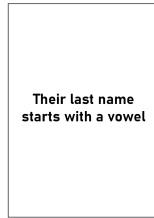
If you write down a Thomas that now one else wrote, score 1 point for originality. If he's a musician, you'll score 3 extra points.



**2nd round:**

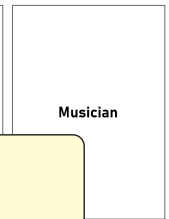
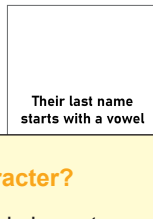
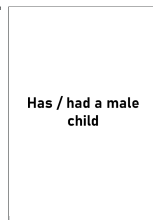
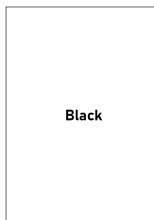
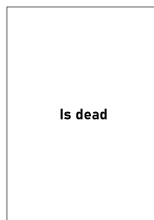
You opened a new card, revealing a new characteristic and a new name. Push the last characteristic to the right to open room for the next one.

Since this is the second round, the new name now is Eric or Erica. If they're a musician, you'll score just +1 point now. If their last name starts with a vowel, you'll score +3 points.



**Last round:**

In the 6th and last round, there will be 6 characteristics. All previous ones score 1 point, and the new one scores 3 points.



**Checking the answers**

You won't be always sure if the person you thought of fits into a characteristic. That's why during the scoring phase, you may use your phone to check the answer online.

You may even check it before the scoring phase, but you can't change your answer after checking your phone.

**What's a celebrity? What's a fictional character?**

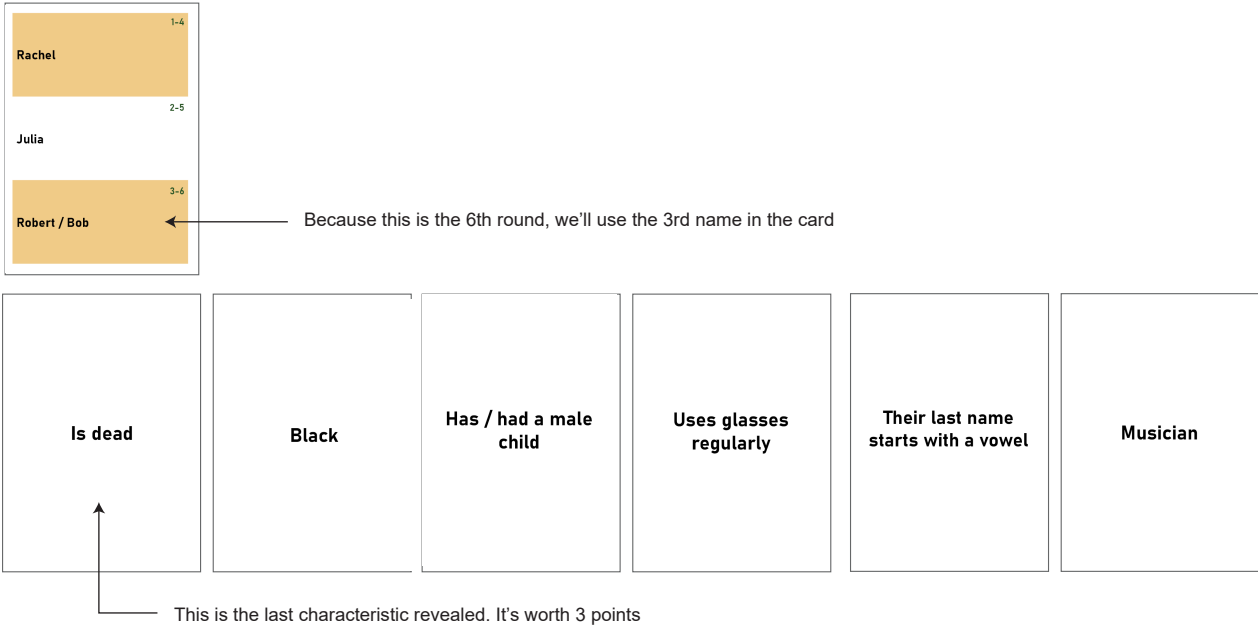
You can only write down celebrities or fictional characters.

**Celebrities** are people relatively well-known by the public, even if it's a small niche. Your family members and acquaintances are probably not celebrities though. Borderline cases (a youtuber with 1000 subscribers?) are left for the group to decide.

**Fictional characters** are characters in books, movies, comics, series, cartoons, etc. They don't need to be human.

**Scoring example:**

Let's simulate the scoring in the last round for a 5-player game.
